

St Anne's Church

The glorious Summer months of the year are in most places devoid of major festivals in the Church calendar. Easter, Whitsuntide and Pentacost mark Springtime and then we look forward to Harvest Festival in the Autumn. But in Over Haddon we also have the Patronal Festival of St Anne, the service for which falls this year on Sunday the 30th of July. This celebrates the “birthday” of the church in this village, which was opened in July 1880, on St Anne's Day.

This service, at the usual time of 10am, has always been a special occasion at St Anne's, and because the 30th of July is a “fifth Sunday” of the month it will also be a Benefice Service, with all four of the other churches in Bakewell Benefice invited to attend. The vicar, Tony Kaunhoven, will take the service, assisted by David Muncie, who some will have met. We will have an organist and, hopefully, a small choir, and refreshments will be served after the service, to which all are welcome to stay. All the church windows will be decorated with flowers, in their rich Summer colours, so it should look (and smell) delightful.

You may have noticed our temporary visitors who reside in the church porch (always left open, for them and everyone else) in Spring and early Summer. I mean, of course, the swallows, who make nests on the beams in the porch and are a constant fascination. They also make quite a mess of course, but hopefully all that will soon be cleaned away, when the youngsters flee the nest....

A longer term problem, which will not go away but which is getting slowly and steadily worse, is the condition of the pathway leading from the gateway to the church door, especially the part immediately below the steps to the porch, where the gravel has eroded away to expose rough stones of the bedrock and which could cause a nasty accident.....so we hope to re-surface the gravel path and lay paving slabs below the porch steps as a long-term improvement.

This will cost money, of course, so as they say, any donations would be much appreciated.

Most of the celebrations took place around the school but I do remember we kids finding a half empty barrel of beer in a shed in Manor Farm bull paddock. We took the opportunity to try what the men had been enjoying but were sadly disappointed by the taste. I can now understand exactly what the men were enjoying.

Some weeks later over a number of days the whole of Lady Manners School went in stages to Matlock Cinema to watch the Coronation again, but this time in colour.

A WORK IN PROGRESS...

At the end of June, the Parish Council invited villagers and parishioners of Over Haddon to an open meeting to discuss the possibility of forming a Parish Plan. The meeting was led by Adele Metcalfe from Peak Park, and 23 people attended. Villagers were invited to air their views on any issues concerning the village and parish. Some problems were identified such as: inconsiderate parking, speed limits, toilets in the car park, broadband speeds, water supply to the allotments, gritting and snow clearance, litter problems, and so on. More positive thoughts turned to Youth groups, tree planting, a history group, a village trail leaflet, a Secret Gardens weekend, an internet café, more socials, plan of the village to help delivery drivers etc. After the meeting Adele collated the ideas into 3 groups—projects we can do ourselves with a little organisation, projects we can do ourselves but may need a bit more planning and some funding, projects that need to work in partnership with other organisations. The evening ended with some folks saying they would be willing to commit time and energy in trying to achieve some of the aims. A further meeting is to be arranged...please look out for the date...everyone welcome to attend.

FRIENDS OF ST ANNE'S APPEAL

Many of you will know of The Friends of St Anne's (FOSA), a charity formed in 2004 to help raise money specifically for the upkeep of our village church and churchyard. Several villagers signed up to regular payments via a standing order, others gave a donation.

At a recent trustees meeting the problem of meeting churchyard maintenance and repair costs, which have steadily increased over the years, was discussed.

A decision was taken to appeal again to all residents to consider supporting St Anne's church, our village church. 
